The project

A.E.P.P. is an international place of reflection commitment, openness to the world and conviviality which aims to help students to make their studies a time of personal growth and development. The residence accepts male and female students coming from a range of cultural, geographical, and religious backgrounds, offering them a warm and open welcome.

We want to be an intellectual and human crossroads offering keys to understanding the modern world concerning reflection, encounters and an ethical approach. An approach rooted in our Protestant tradition which in our eyes is more important than ever in the times of current changes.

Particularity of the Student Residence AEPP : The freedom given to students (the home is mixed and they are free to come and go as they please and to invit friends) as well as their participation in the association's activities, and in the management of the residence. So many opportunities, with the learning of debate that community life represents, allows them to experience adult autonomy and will help them to become responsible men and women in today's world.

AEPP THE RESIDENCE

The residence, a building of 2000 m² with private garden, patio and sports terrace, is located in a quiet neighborhood of artists and artisans, close to Bastille, and very well served by public transportation. It welcomes boys and girls from all backgrounds.

Attached to the values of respect and pluralism of French Protestantism, the association does not require any religious affiliation or engagement. However, adherence to the values of solidarity and mutual respect is essential.

Completely renovated in 2006, the building meets the most recent safety, comfort and facilities standards, it has a capacity of 100 students and includes:

4 floors plus two levels dedicated to life and common activities

30 single and double rooms (with a bathroom shared between 2 rooms) and 4 studios with Kitchenette receiving students for the entire academic year or per night.

8 duplex apartments

With mezzanine and 4 beds (large rooms with 2 beds per floor, private toilet and washbasin) that can accommodate students of passage throughout the year,

Basement facilities; meeting rooms with disabled access, Internet access (500Mbps fiber) and video facilities (with modular capacities from 35 to 200 m² homologated to accommodate groups of 30, 60, 120 or 200 people), which can be made available to associations or organizations for courses, conferences or seminars, or used by residents when not in use. Laundry room (washing machine, dryer) accessible 24/24.

Ground floor: comfortable and functional common areas which can be accessed freely, with common room, patio, study room, dining room, living space, library and fully equipped shared kitchen (ovens, hotplates, microwave, fridge)

1st Floor with garden terrace and sports area.

An efficient Internet network (fiber 500Mbps) in each room and in all public areas

The association was founded in 1892 by around 40 students, with Jean Monnier to organise meetings, monthly conferences, work groups, groups studying religious and topical issues. In 1896, the organisation became the "Cercle des Etudiants Protestants de Paris". The students became actively involved in the activities and functioning of the association. This circle quickly became an important centre of Paris' student community, not only as an intellectual hub, but also a place of conviviality. Its influence spread out beyond Paris, as it participated in the creation of the French Federation of Christian Students' Associations (FFUACE), known as the Fédédé. In the interwar period, following statutory changes, the circle became the Association des Etudiants Protestants de Paris (AEPP), which was recognised as a public utility on the 11 th March 1923. In this same period, it became the owner of the building at 46 Rue de Vaugirard and began a residential activity. These residents became the core of the Association, organising conferences, groups, and exhibitions. During the Second World War, the Association was forced to cease its activities following a decision made by the occupying authorities. However, the residence and the restaurant remained, under the responsibility of the French Reformed Church. The Association's activities restarted after the war, and in the 1950's, 46 Rue de Vaugirard was a place of learning and of lively debate. After 1968, the residence's activities stopped. The AEPP became a space for free speech and a forum for Associations. In 1981 the committee of the AEPP decided to return to the Association's original mission. The residence and its activities were reborn with the assistance of the students. In 2001, the association sold the premises at Rue de Vaugirard. In 2006, a more spacious building was acquired, located at 4 rue Titon, where the new residence and centre of student activity opened in september 2007.

The associative network

The AEPP is a member of the Fédération Protestante de France and the Fédération Française des Associations Chrétiennes d'Etudiants (FFACE Fédédé,) who représent in France the FUACE/WSCF (Universal Federation of Christian Students). This membership allows residents of AEPP to participate in meetings abroad (ex Jordanie, Suède, Egypte, Sicile, Rome) and to pursue personal opportunities in an international context.

FULL YEAR OR MONTHLY STAY

The residence can accommodate students for the duration of the academic year (September to June) in single or double rooms

The residence can also host all year long students for month or year stays (tourism, exchanges, Erasmus, internships...) in Duplex (big rooms with 2 floors, 2 beds per floor each, with private WC and lavabo).

RATES SEPTEMBER 2023 /JUNE 2024 FOR A LONG STAY (between one year and one month)

- Double room: 540€ monthly
- Single room : 740€ monthly
- Duplex : 490€ monthly for a stay of at least one month

SHORT OR DAILY STAYS

Accommodation for short stays (nights, weeks or wee-end) is possible during summer holidays in single or double rooms, and all year long in duplex

- Double room: 35 € night /person
- Single room : 75€ night
- Duplex : 25 € night /person

Deposit : One month rent for more than 10 days, 50 € for less

FACILITIES AND FREE SERVICES

The price includes a lot of free services:

- breakfast (baguettes, cereal, jam, hot drinks etc.),
 - furniture of sheets (for stays less than one year)
 - Wi-Fi access free
 - use of shared kitchen with ovens, hotplates, microwave, as well as refrigerator space to store their provisions.
 - use of garden, work room, lounge, and library,
 - use of sport equipped terrasse
 - use of laundry (washing machines and dryers free of charge),
 - free access to the courses and activities organized in the residence.
